In the revised Statement of Community Involvement it is not made clear what is a DPD (Development Plan Document). In para. 5.1. it is attached to Site Specific Allocations but in the diagram at para 5.2. it shows that the Core Strategy, Site Specific Allocations, Adopted Proposals Map, Area Action Plans and other Development Plans are all DPDs.

The glossary tells us that a DPD contains local authority planning policy and has been subjected to independent public examination and has statutory plan status. Are DPDs then the successors of the LDP (Local Development Plan) which at present is the Warwick District Local Plan? If so this needs to be explained.

The key on the diagram at para. 5.2 indicates Required, Optional and Project Plan, the text does not say what this means; does it show what it is optional to consult on, or does it show what is an optional document?

We suggest that SECTION 5-Background should be made clearer and either placed at the beginning of the document, incorporated into SECTION 1-Introduction, or relocated as SECTION 2. By doing so the line A) Local Development Framework which appears for the first time, without explanation, at paragraphs 2.1, 3.1 and 4.1 will be properly connected with the text and the status of a DPD fully understood.

It would be a help if there was an updated list in the SCI of the documents in the LDS (Local Development Scheme) which combine to form the LDF (Local Development Framework) indicating which are DPDs and which are SPDs (Supplementary Planning Documents) without having to consult a web site.
