

Key statistics from the State of Nature report (2023) show that since 1970:

More species have seen their populations **decrease** than **increase**.



The abundance of **753** **terrestrial** and **freshwater** **species** has on average **fallen** by **19%**



Pollinators, such as bees, hoverflies and moths, have on average decreased by

18%



The distributions of invertebrates have on average **deceased** by

13%

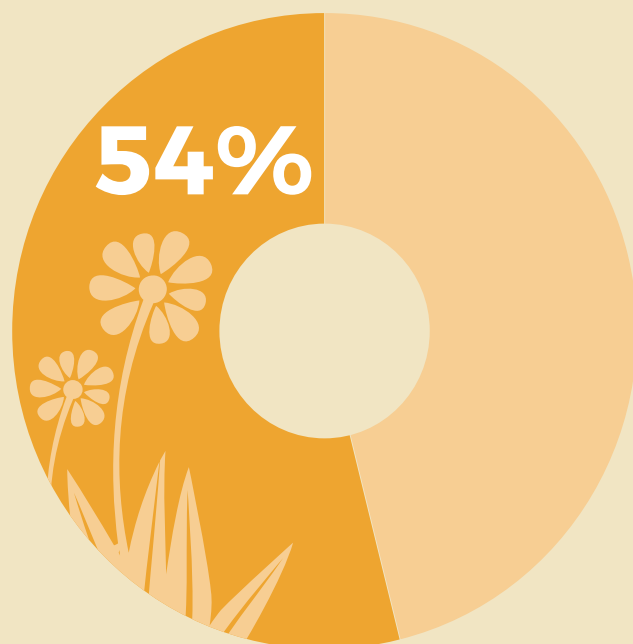
