



Sample Timetable

Cost: £150 x 30 children

Arrival at 10:00

10:00-10:30 – Formalities (fire drill, toilets, coats, rules in the museum, etc...), class stays together for a short history of The Royal Pump Rooms, then at 10:30, the class will split in two.

10:30-11:30 -Group A will go to the Craft Room and proceed with making clay elephants, Group B will be able to undertake a self-led tour of the museum. We will supply you with appropriate trails looking at the art gallery and the museum. There will also be some little activities for the children to do.

11:30-11:45 – short break – if the weather is nice they can be taken out to the park for a run around – school staff will monitor this part of the day as gallery staff will set up for the second session

11:45–12:45 - the groups swap over and do the relevant activities

12:45-13:00 – Groups come together, take coats, etc.. and leave promptly at 13:00.

Clay work group (15 children)

Children will be working with air dry clay and will decorate the elephants with coloured gems. We will build in a bit of planning time so that they can think of the colours they might like to use. If there is a bit of spare time, the children can have some clay and play with. Our staff are trained to deliver the workshop but we ask that any behavioural issues be dealt with by school staff. Our staff will guide children in the workshop and will do their best so that every child is able to access the workshop in the best and most appropriate way for them. We want all the children to enjoy their visit. If you could let us know in advance if there are any particular needs we should be aware of, that would be most helpful.

Trail group (15 children – we recommend splitting this group into 2 smaller groups – trail in art gallery and Hammam (30 mins) and then Haddie’s Gallery (30 mins))

Our trail is based on the Hammam – the Turkish baths – and involves looking at patterns and designing a decoration for the Hammam. The other part of it is looking at the paintings in the gallery and drawing their own version. We will supply pencil crayons and clipboards. We also have Haddie’s Gallery where the children will have the opportunity to play with some of our toys, read some books and do some drawing. We think that splitting the group into a 7 and 8 will work better for this activity in order to make the most of the spaces available.
